Bread of Life – smell of bread baking, give loaves of bread away to 1st-time

Saltwater – bitter, maybe not too good!

Positive and negative smells

Have someone with a "new" nose walk through the church and see what it smells like (coffee, bread, bathrooms, etc.)

Lemons → lemonade

Give out Hershey kisses

Cookies with different ingredients missing

Be careful – some people don't like hugs

Christ's touches – healed blind man and leper, picked up children, washed disciples' feet

Other Biblical examples – laying on of hands, anointing with oil

Prostrating oneself – bowing down

Write sins on a paper and nail it to a cross or burn it in a fire

Rocks, nails, coins, rope
